Mayor's Report:

Mayor Millman stated that the Village is currently undertaking the change over of our website and all emails to dot gov. The new emails will be <u>MontebelloNY.gov</u>. This is mandated by New York State and we apologize for any inconvenience this may cause during the change.

Mayor Millman reminded everyone of the Memorial Day Remembrance Celebration on Sunday, May 25th. The ceremony will be held on the Village lawn starting at 9 AM. This year's speaker is Vietnam Veteran, Barry Fixler. There will be the Color Guard and students from the local elementary school reading the Gettysburg Address, with refreshments to follow.

Mayor Millman announced that he attended the Town of Ramapo Police Awards. Congratulations to all those who were recognized for outstanding Police and Detective work.

Mayor Millman stated that there was also a memorial service for Police Officers in New City this past week.

Mayor Millman stated that the County of Rockland is currently working on its Comprehensive Plan Update 2025-2026 called "Envision Rockland". All county residents are able to attend the meetings. Please check the County website for a location near you.

Mayor Millman stated that the Route 59 project adjacent to the new construction of the Senior Assisted Living Facility to connect the internal road to Route 59 and improving the frontage is moving forward.

Mayor Millman stated that the proposed cell tower by Homeland Towers is currently undergoing test transmissions in the location of the community center to confirm potential benefit.

Mayor Millman reminded everyone of the upcoming Montebello Jazz Festival which will take place on Sunday, September 7th from 12 noon to 6 pm on Village grounds. The Mayor stated that they have confirmed three noteworthy groups.

Mayor Millman reminds residents that walk, run, or bike on the roadways to be mindful of the vehicles and not hamper the roadway.

Mayor Millman stated that if you see something that looks unusual, please call the police. There were recently two homes that were burglarized in Montebello. The police state that it does not look like the "normal" ring of thieves. Be mindful and lock your doors when you are not at home and leave lights on.

Building Department Report:

The following is the Building Department Report for the month of April 2025:

- (17) building permits were filed. A total of \$13,220.00 in permit fees were collected.
- (13) Certificates of Occupancy were issued.
- (11) locations were inspected; \$6,450.00 in Fire Inspection fees were collected during the month.
- (14) code violations were issued. (6) Appearance tickets were issued.

Historic Preservation and Parks Commission (HPPC) Report

The committee met on May 7, 2025.

- There were no applications for Certificates of Appropriateness this month.
- The Commission and Keep Rockland Beautiful are ready for Montebello Clean-Up Day on Saturday, May 17th running from 9:00 AM until 12:00 PM. Rain date is Sunday, May 18th.
- Preparation for the Jazz Festival has begun. Cousins Maine Lobster truck from last year is booked again. Other food trucks have been contacted; the Commission is waiting for their responses.
- Each member has been assigned a role in helping to keep the Commission focused and organized.
- A walkthrough of KGPP took place, during which several questions arose. An email was sent out for clarification.
- In the Park programs were discussed and several activities and class ideas were suggested. Prior to moving forward, the Commission wanted to know the procedure Village Hall has followed in the past before reaching out to potential instructors and program heads.

Public Comment:

No one else from the public wishing to speak, Mayor Millman closed this portion of the meeting.

Suffern High School Montebello Top 10%

Mayor Millman welcomed the Top 10% Montebello students from Suffern High School and their families. Each student who was present was awarded with a Certificate of Academic Achievement and posed for pictures with the Mayor and the Village Board of Trustees.

Presentation: Stonehedge

Mr. Marsel Amona discussed the request he had made to the Board. The Mayor and the Board discussed Mr. Amona's request and discussed the site visit of the location. A sense of the Board was taken and a vote pending insertion of formal Resolution as follows:

Title: Request for Informal Reaction Re: Amending Stonehedge Heights Subdivision Located on Spook Rock Road within both Rural Preservation and Historic and Scenic Overlay Districts

WHEREAS, Marsel Amona, by and for the Stonehedge Heights Subdivision, appeared before the Village Board on April 23, 2025 and again tonight, and in the interim and as suggested, the Village Board visited the site, observed the vistas and woodlands and staked proposed incursion into the 200 ft. preservation area to permit construction of a portion of the required storm water retention basin thus sparing one of the lots virtual elimination of most of a usable backyard, which Mr. Amona claimed would greatly decrease the usability and value of said lot inconsistent with the higher end houses to be built within said subdivision; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Amona, having already informally discussed the matter with the Planning Board, understood that to make such an amendment he would have to formally apply to the Planning Board which would have to hold a Public Hearing declaring itself as lead agency and conduct a coordinated review under SEQRA, and under Section 195-64.1 of the Village Code, the HPPC would have to hold a Public Hearing to decide whether a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) should be issued, but, also, that only the Village Board has authority to allow incursion into the 200 ft. preservation area in its discretion for purposes accessory to the cluster subdivision provided that the purposes of preserving the rural woodland character of the Rural Preservation Overlay District are met and, therefore, he sought a preliminary polling of the Village Board in order to guide himself as to the feasibility of making such an application; and

WHEREAS, after discussion before the Village Board, a field viewing of the site, and due consideration of the documents, a discussion ensued wherein it was informally and preliminarily agreed that such incursion into the protected area would have a minimal impact on the woodlands rural character due to the topography, location, and present vegetation of the impacted area, subject to fencing of an appropriate in type, and reduced in height to 4 feet, and additional plantings of evergreens or fir trees, added to obscure any view of such incursion, both supplementing existing vegetation plus adding where more sparse; and

WHEREAS, the Board was polled with respect to the above understanding and potential result, and such was not opposed to the change, voting 4 to 1 as indicative of present attitude as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planner is directed to prepare all necessary forms in his/her judgment to the extent required under SEQRA, for this Board's consideration as Lead Agency at the Public Hearing.

WHEREAS, the Village's Financial Consultant, Donalee Berard, has under her cover of May 7, 2025 authored her analysis of the records of the Village of Montebello's Justice Court, and the Justice Court Bail records to determine adherence to court procedures and compile relevant operating data and to determine if the Bail account held sufficient assets to cover the associated liability, which analysis is likewise dated May 7, 2025; both documents (hereinafter "The Reports") referenced hereat as if fully set forth hereinafter, true copies of which shall be appended to the minutes hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has reviewed the Reports and associated records, and confirms the conclusions drawn by the Village's Financial Consultant.

Title: Colliers Engineering & Design for Route 59 Improvement Project (LOC Draw)

WHEREAS, the Mayor, Village Attorney, Village Clerk, and Village Engineer report working collectively in furtherance of the intent and authority as granted and set forth by the Village Board in Resolution 25-021 approved February 19, 2025, including giving the required notice, calling and drawing the full sum represented by the Montebello Crossing Standby Letter of Credit, depositing same and setting up prudent accounting procedures as guided by the Village's Financial consultant; and

WHEREAS, in further exercise of the above authority and intent, the Village Engineer reviewed in detail the status of the DOT application for the Route 59 frontage work as tentatively approved on or about May 2024, the contract documents and plans, and other related site work covered by the LOC, and has negotiated an agreement with Colliers Engineering & Design, the original design engineer on the project, to complete said design work and application , to obtain said Permit and to oversee said work as Project Engineer, all according to a Proposal for Professional Services, Route 59 Improvements, Village of Montebello, Proposal No. 25005930P, as dated April 16, 2025 , referenced as if set forth hereinafter, a true copy to be appended to the Minutes hereof, at a total estimated cost of not to exceed about \$20,000 , tasked as follows: Final Plan Compliance Review and Plan Modifications (\$3000); Engineer's Estimate (\$2500); Permit Application and Construction Bid Document Preparation(if any) (\$3800); and , RFI Responses and Construction Phase Support(allowance) (\$7500);and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, Village Attorney and Village Clerk report having met with and regularly communicated with the Village Engineer, and that all details on the design work, construction documents, and logically splitting work into phases starting with the frontage work are close to fruition; and

WHEREAS, time being of the essence given Lot1, the ALF, is preparing to open and the emergency access already granted via the secondary access; and, in attempting to get the benefit of the economics of contracts extended approximately one year ago; finalizing DOT approval versus starting a new approval, each now almost one year old, the owner of Lot1 agreeing informally to assign the benefit of contractual arrangements it may have made, and also extending permission to come on to perform said work under the cross easements between the owners of all impacted lots; and, the new owner of Lots 2 and 3 also agreeing informally that the Village could come onto its lots to complete the frontage work; and the Village Attorney reporting his opinion that although the frontage part of the work should be done under Prevailing Wages, under case law, since the LOC monies are considered private not public funds, the Village has the option of taking over and negotiating the private contracts versus seeking proposals by a formal bidding process; and

WHEREAS, under the broad authority granted by the Village Board in the circumstances, the Mayor after discussion with the Board executed said Proposal when tendered on or about April 25, 2025, but in an abundance of caution did so intending to obtain ratification by the Village Board.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the above reported activities are found consistent with the intent of the Village Board, in the best interests of the public, and that said Proposal with Colliers Engineering & Design be and hereby is approved retroactive to the date of execution.
